### Avondale Launches Hometown Hero Program To Benefit Veteran Success Center

The Avondale Municipal Art Committee is sponsoring a Hometown Hero streetlight banner program to showcase the faces of the city's military veterans. The banners will be displayed on streetlight poles in major corridors around national holidays such as Memorial Day and Veterans Day. A \$50 application fee will benefit the Veteran Success Center serving veterans in the West Valley. Applications due May 31, 2018.

To be eligible, an individual must be serving in the U.S. Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines and Coast Guard); or veterans who were honorably discharged or given their life in service in the U.S. Armed Forces. The individual must also be, or have been, a permanent resident of Avondale during some point, or have a close family member (spouse, parent, legal guardian, grandparent, child or sibling) currently living in Avondale.
