14 Veterans Bills Passed Prior to Memorial Day

On May 21, 2018, Rep. Phil Roe, M.D. (R-Tenn.), chairman of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, issued a press release announcing that the House had passed 14 veterans bills. His comments were as follows:

"In the week leading up to one of the most solemn days of remembrance for our nation, it is fitting we take steps to honor the men and women who have served this country by passing legislation to improve the lives of veterans. These measures will provide a cost-of-living-adjustment for disabled veterans; bring increased accountability to the Department of Veterans Affairs; and ensure veterans have access to the care and resources they have earned — to name a few of the provisions included in these important bills. As we honor the memory of the heroes who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our nation, I am proud the House is coming together once again to move bipartisan legislation to keep our promises to the men and women who have served."

Access Healthcare Easily with VA Video Connect

Now Veterans can receive healthcare treatment virtually with VA Video Connect from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. This system allows users to connect with health-care teams over live video from a computer, tablet or smart phone directly from home – increasing access to VA health care and reducing travel times. More than 20,000 Veterans have used VA Video Connect to receive care, and currently more than 4,000 VA providers across the country are set up to use the system.
