

The Maricopa County Community College District (MCCCD) has been granted \$4915 from the Arizona Department of Veterans Services (AZDVS) to take four students and a staff member to the annual Student Veterans of America Conference in January 2019. This support includes conference registration fees, travel, hotel, and food. This is the third year in a row that AZDVS had sponsored students from MCCCD to attend. This conference provides seminars, workshops, and networking sessions on solutions to the challenges that student veterans face, and each year, the students who attend are always eager to return to their respective colleges to share their experiences and knowledge gained with their classmates.
